Community & Family Resources (CFR) is focused on providing integrated and exceptional behavioral health treatment and prevention services to those seeking help for substance use, mental health, problem gambling, or co-occurring issues. Originally founded as a nonprofit agency in 1968, today CFR serves 14 counties across the state of Iowa; in Eastern Iowa, this includes Johnson, Cedar, Iowa & Washington Counties. Treatment services offered in Iowa City include: residential substance use treatment, outpatient substance use and problem gambling treatment, outpatient mental health therapy, outpatient psychiatry, Synchrony Employee Assistance Program (EAP), transitional housing apartments, and medication assisted treatment (MAT). Additionally, sobering services & medically monitored intensive inpatient (detoxification) services are offered by CFR at the GuideLink Center in Iowa City. The Prevention Department is available to provide a wide array of evidence-based programs focused on preventing misuse of alcohol, tobacco, other drugs & gambling. Medicaid, Medicare, & private insurance are accepted. Treatment services are available on a sliding fee scale for those who qualify. Community & Family Resources is part of the IHHS Integrated Provider Network, with services funded by the Iowa Department of Health & Human Services and the U.S. Dept. of Health & Human Services Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration.

Programs support the childcare workforce through education, consultation, and other resources to aid with retention in the field and works closely within the refugee and immigrant population to identify individuals to work in the childcare field. 4Cs administers the federal food program to promote healthy eating, fostering brain growth during its most rapid time, from birth to five years. Other services include crisis childcare for Johnson County families when emergent childcare needs arise, operating the Home Ties Child Care Center which cares for children primarily on childcare assistance. Families experiencing crisis, such as homelessness, may receive free care while working on personal goals, such as finding permanent housing, reliable transportation, or stable employment.
